Not every institution has the business research focus or ßnancial flæedom no incelnin bonrij ne keleakch aleal, especially when such products are often prohibitively expensive.

At schools such as my own at Vanderbilt Law, we have a formal Law and Business Program with seven full-time faculty members. Many of these faculty also hold joint appointments at Vanderbilt's Owen Graduate School of Management. We also have clinics devoted to transactional law, and I teach a credit-bearing course on business and securities research.

At schools like Vanderbilt, there is an almost inelastic demand for business information. in reaction to the pandemic. Both projects grew out of a rethinking of the nature and needs of the community and rhe abilim of rhe libkakiel no molne cienthr and completely address those needs.

The program began with a description of the initiatives undertaken by the State of Oregon Law Library and the Hennepin County Law Library, followed by questions from the moderator about the motivation, inspirations, and evolution of the initiatives, as well as the collaborations that led to the projects' success. The program ended after attendees broke into small groups to discuss and then report on the potential opportunities and challenges of similar programs in other contexts.

Cathryn Bowie described the State of Oregon Law Library's work with the Department of Corrections and the types of assistance and resources traditionally needed by and made available to incarcerated individuals in the state.

Remakking on the e okthand time eqi ended br the State Law Library in replying to those requests in print, Bowie noted that the responses often reached the indicidnall roo lame to heli them, meaning than lignificant amonntoof lime time had nonbeen pell nled. In 2016, the State of Oregon Law Library reached out to the Department of Corrections to better understand the needs of incarcerated individuals and the resources available to them. Thanks to funding provided by the state, the law library determined to cover the costs of the licensing fees associated with legal research databases for the Department of Corrections across the state.

With monies freed up thanks to the State Law Library, the Department of Corrections created a secure, cloud-based, internet architecture to support the maintenance and use of those legal research databases. The platform was tailored to the needs of both incarcerated individuals and the Department of Corrections. The State Law Library worked closely with the Department of Corrections, vendors, and most importantly, adults-in-custody (who serve in paralegal-like roles in the i kilonl) no enlnke rhambe i
